We were all disappointed when Volunteer Central closed their doors this past June. The Red Deer Community will miss the training, support and connections that Volunteer Central provided.

Unfortunately, we know that our data is incomplete this year. Many organizations have struggled to get students to fill out the evaluation forms. The online platform does not provide an easy way for students to fill out the forms.

Central Alberta Mental Health Association Provided one on one morning phone calls to clients who were struggling.

CASASC trained 138 new volunteers for their 24hour Phone, text, and Webchat Crisis Line. They provided support for 1,736 individuals this year.

CARE'S online ESL classes have reached students from all over Alberta, including Edmonton.

Even though The John Howard Society was unable to provide face to face programming at the Remand Centre, they were still able to help 58 students with independent studies.

All of our funded Organizations have worked tirelessly to provide support, and programming for their students this past year. During a time when so many are struggling, it is the work of organizations like these, that makes a difference in the lives of students.
